- Each entry must be accompanied by a remittance unless otherwise stated.
- All perpetual trophies to be returned to one of the Secretaries no later than 7 days before the show.
- Trade Stands charges (per 15 foot) £16 to be paid in advance - FOC charities.
- Judging of Horse and Pony classes will commence at 9.30am.
- Riding hats must be worn at all times. No child under 3 years to compete in horse and pony classes. Jackets must be worn for all show jumping classes. No entry money refunded in horse classes.
