- Any objection or protest is to be made in writing to the Secretary with a £10.00 deposit.
- The Judges decision will be final.
- Sheep Dog Trials will commence at 12.00 noon and a prompt start is essential.
- Presentations of trophies to be held at 4.00pm (approx.) Adjacent to the main tent.
- Each entry must be accompanied by a remittance unless otherwise stated.
- All perpetual trophies to be returned to one of the Secretaries no later than 7 days before the show.
- Trade Stands charges (per 15 foot) £18 to be paid in advance - FOC charities.
- Judging of the Horse and Pony section to commence at 9.30am.
- Competitors' numbers to be collected from Horse & Pony Sec's tent on show day
- Riding hats to British Safety Standards must be worn at all times when mounted and handling in the ring.
- No child under 3yrs may compete in horse and pony classes.
- No entry money will be refunded in horse and pony classes.
- Horses and ponies competing to be covered by Third Party Public Liability Insurance and owners must ensure that the person attending an animal is competent in the handling of it.
