- Presentations of trophies to be held at 4.00pm (approx.) Adjacent to the main tent.
- Each entry must be accompanied by a remittance unless otherwise stated.
- All perpetual trophies to be returned to one of the Secretaries no later than 7 days before the show.
- Trade Stands charges (per 15 foot) £18 to be paid in advance - FOC charities.
- Judging of the Horse and Pony section to commence at 9.30am.
- Competitors' numbers to be collected from Horse & Pony Sec's tent on show day

Set Recipe

Farmhouse Fruit Cake

1lb. (450g) Self Raising Flour
6oz. (175g) Margarine
8oz. (225g) Sugar
1 Egg (beaten)

½pt. (300ml) Milk
8oz (225g) Mixed Fruit
1 Teaspoon Mixed Spice

8in (20cm) tin greased and lined
Oven; Gas 3, 170°C, 150°C Fan

Rub the margarine into the flour.

Add sugar, fruit and mixed spice and mix well.

Make a well in the ingredients and pour in beaten egg and milk.

Stir until the mixture is of "a dropping consistency", adding a little more milk if necessary.

Pour into the prepared tin and bake in a preheated oven for around 1½ to 2 hours.
